The Acharya of Srimad Bhagavatam

The glorious service of Śrī Raghunāth Paņḍit in Varāha Nagar.

Today is the day Śrīman Mahāprabhu visited Śrī Varāha Nagar. This Pastime is described in *Śrī Chaitanya-bhāgavat* (Antya-khaņḍa, 5.110–124):

tabe prabhu āilena varāha-nagare mahābhāgyavanta eka brāhmaņera ghare

The Lord then came to the home of an extremely fortune brahman in Varaha Nagar.

sei vipra bada suśiksita bhāgavate prabhu dekhi' bhāgavata lāgilā padite

The brāhman was highly learned in *Śrīmad Bhāgavatam*, and upon seeing the Lord, he began to recite the text.

śuniyā tāhāna bhakti-yogera paṭhana āviṣṭa hailā gaurachandra nārāyaṇa

Hearing his devout recitation, Lord Gaurachandra became ecstatic.

ʻbala bala' bale prabhu śrī-gaurāṅga-rāya huṅkāra garjana prabhu karaye sadāya

The Lord loudly and repeatedly roared, "Read on! Read on!"

sei vipra pade parānande magna haiyā prabhu o karena nṛtya bāhya pāsariyā

As the brahman read, immersed in divine ecstasy, the Lord danced and lost external awareness.

bhaktira mahimā-śloka śunite śunite punaḥ punaḥ āchhāḍa paḍena pṛthivīte

As the Lord heard verses glorifying devotion, He tumbled to the earth again and again.

hena se karena prabhu premera prakāśa āchāḍa dekhite sarva-loke pāya trāsa

The Lord manifest such divine love. The sight of His tumbling frightened everyone.

ei mata rātri tina-prahara-avadhi bhāgavata śuniyā nāchilā guņa-nidhi

The Lord, the ocean of qualities, listened to the *Bhāgavatam* and danced in this way for nine hours of the night.

bāhya pāi' vasilena śrī-śachī-nandana santoșe dvijere karilena ālingana

Eventually, He regained external awareness and embraced that brahman with satisfaction.

prabhu bale, "bhāgavata e-mata paḍite kabhu nāhi śuni āra kāharo mukhete The Lord said. "I have never heard such recitation of the *Bhāgavat* from anyone!

eteke tomāra nāma 'bhāgavatāchārya' ihā vinā āra kona nā kariha kārya"

"Your name is therefore Bhagavat Acharya. Do not perform any duty other than this.

vipra-prati prabhura padavī yogya śuni' sabe karilena mahā-hari-hari-dhvani

Hearing the Lord's befitting title for the brahman, everyone cheered, "Hari! Hari!"

ei mata prati-grāme grāme gangā-tīre rahiyā rahiyā prabhu bhaktera mandire

The Lord visited the houses of devotees in all the villages along the bank of the Ganges in this way.

sabāra kariyā manoratha pürna kāma punah äilena prabhu nīlāchala-dhāma

The Lord fulfilled all the devotees' desires and then returned to Nīlāchal.

gauda-deśe punar-bāra prabhura vihāra ihā ye śunaye tāra duhkha nahe āra

Anyone who hears about the Lord's Pastimes during His return to Bengal will never suffer again.

In his commentary on Śrī Chaitanya-charitāmrta (Ādi-līlā, 10.113), Śrīla Bhakti Siddhānta Saraswatī Thakur cites from the above verses and adds:

nirmitā pustikā vena krsna-prema-taranginī śrīmad bhāgavatāchāryo gaurāngātyanta vallabha

(Gaura-ganoddeśa-dīpikā: 203)

"Bhāgavat Āchārya wrote a book entitled Krsna-prema-taranginī, and was extremely dear to Śrī Gaurānga.'

Bhāgavat Āchārya's name was Śrī Raghunāth Paņdit. His ashram was in the Māli neighbourhood of Varāha Nagar, about three miles north of Kolkata on the bank of Ganges."

Krsna-prema-taranginī was the first full translation of Śrīmad Bhāgavatam into Bengali verse. Śrī Raghunath Bhagavat Acharya composed this after receiving the blessings of Sriman Mahaprabhu during His visit to Varāha Nagar. Śrīla Bhakti Vinod Thākur desired to publish this text but was unable to find a legible authentic copy of it after publicly requesting one in *Śrī Sajjana-tosanī*. It has since been published in numerous editions by the followers of Śrīla Bhakti Siddhānta Saraswatī Thākur.

The following is an excerpt from an article about Śrī Bhāgavat Āchārya by Śrīla Bhakti Vinod Thākur published in 1898 in Volume 9, Issue 12, of Śrī Sajjana-tosanī:

"When the associates of Krsna and Gaura are examined, it is understood that Srī Rādhikā's sakhī Śyāma Mañjarī appeared in the Pastimes of Śrī Gaura as Śrī Bhāgavat Āchārya. In the Pastimes of Śrī Krsna, Śrī Śyāma Mañjarī sings songs about Krsna (songs about the Pastimes of Śyām) for Śrī Rādhā and Krsna. As Śrī Bhāgavat Āchārya in the Pastimes of Śrī Gaura, he performed his service by reciting Śrīmad Bhāgavatam for Śrī Gaurānga; Śrī Rādhā gave him this service in Śrī Krsna's Pastimes. In the Pastimes of Śrī Gaura, Śrī Gadādhar Pandit Goswāmī took him into his line [accepted him as a disciple] and gave him suitable service to Śrī Gaurāṅga. The special characteristic of Śrī Bhāgavat Āchārya's service is that when Śrī Gaurāṅga came with His associates to his kuñja in Varāha Nagar, he began to perform his eternal service of reciting *Śrīmad Bhāgavatam* instead of washing the Lord's feet, offering the Lord water to drink, and performing the other customary services of a host. The sakhīs' only duty is the service given by Śrī Rādhā; this principle is shown by this Pastime."
